



**Erica Woodley** is an Assistant Dean of Students/Case Manager at Tulane University in New Orleans. During her time at Tulane, she has also served as an Area Director and the Director of Residence Life within Housing and Residence Life. She was part of the student evacuation team during Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and helped set up a call center for displaced students, faculty, and staff in Houston, Texas in the immediate aftermath. She was actively involved in the recovery efforts within Housing and Residence at Tulane after their campus sustained damage in 95 percent of the residential buildings.
